TANIS CHALOPIN



Tanis is an exceptional composer and producer, gifted with a unique musical and visual sense. At 14-years-old, Disney Asia selected her from among many young musicians, to compose the main score of their feature film, *The Trail of the Panda*. Since then, she never stopped composing and writing, working on films, Television series and commercials for various genres in China, the United Kingdom, France, and the United States.

Tanis attended Steinhardt College at New York University, where she studied music composition and film scoring. She graduated four years later, summa cum laude, and received the prestigious Elmer Bernstein Award for Film Scoring (previously awarded to graduate-level students only), the Richard Hirsch Memorial Award for Exceptional Achievement and the Founder's Award.

A TREATISE: MY LIFE, MY WORK

Maybe it's because my father sang to me the very first second he held me in his arms, or maybe because there was always music playing in all corners of the houses where we lived, but I simply cannot imagine what my life would be without music. There is music associated with everything I do, everything I see, everything I feel, as if there was a personal scoring in my head for every instance of my life. And, it is rather strange, as no one in my family is a musician.

I am born from French and Singaporean parents, with Italian, Chinese, Latin-American, American-Irish and American-French ancestors. I grew up in a multi-cultural family, spent my youth in France, The Bahamas, Switzerland, China, the United Kingdom and the United States, and learned a few languages. But music remains the language I love the most, deeply rooted in my mind, with a syntax that is both constantly fresh and universally accessible.

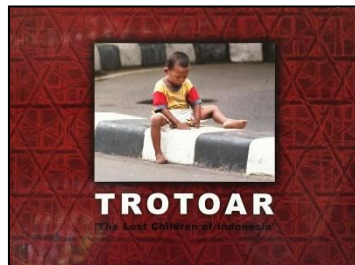
Exploring music is a way of exploring myself at the same time. It is a means of communication that offers expressions deeper and more emotionally than words alone can capture. Whereas words tend to pin down and mark meanings distinctly, music suggests possibilities of understanding that are unbound for each listener, as it interacts with the inner, emotional fiber of each and every one. This is why I love the interplay of sound and images.

Music can bring new narrative, and infer new depths to an image, to the point of changing it altogether, accentuating the responsibility of the musician scoring the film.

In many ways, it seems I ‘see’ music and ‘hear’ images. Imagination is the obvious link between both. It naturally brought me to become a photographer, also at a young age.

It was Micky, an eight-month-old baby boy I met at a small neighboring orphanage in Beijing, who gave me the vision I needed. Micky had been abandoned at birth in the freezing cold of the Yantai hillside, Shandong Province in China, and nearly froze to death. As a result, his left toe had to be amputated. Unfortunately, Micky was also diagnosed with a congenital, complicated heart disease needing surgery, and fought through all kinds of illness his first year of life. I felt compelled to help him from the day I saw him.

Sadly, he passed away on February 14, 2009, but his silent courage was my inspiration to help unwanted children, abandoned not only by their parents, but also by a society in search of minimum responsibility and involvement. Since that day, my photographs have served to raise money for these children and for the Shui people of China, through sales of my books.
