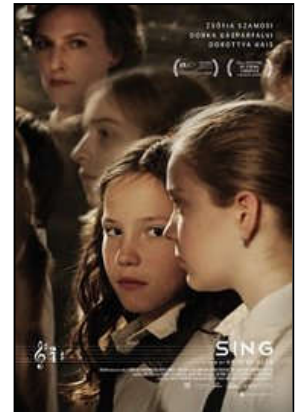

AKOS LUSTYIK



Akos Lustyik is a classically trained composer from Budapest, Hungary. Completing his studies at the Franz Liszt Academy of Music in Budapest, he has subsequently earned the distinction of Graduate Scholar of the Royal Academy of Music with Distinction, London, where he completed his master's in film music composition. Akos also holds a degree in economics and management from Budapest University of Technology and Economics, and speaks Hungarian, English and German.

An early highlight of his music career was being a part of the 2017 Academy Award-winning *Sing* (Kristóf Deák, dir.), Best Live Action Short. He assisted noted Hollywood film composer Adam Balazs as conductor, music editor and assistant music supervisor. Also in 2017, Akos was awarded at the Transatlantyk Film Music Competition, a part of the Lodz Transatlantyk International Film and Music Festival, Poland, an event where he was a finalist the previous year.



During his Academy years, Akos worked in Hungarian theatre, composing for plays in several Budapest theatres, and as a music director in several additional projects. His recent composition, *At the Hawk's Well* by W.B. Yeats, resulted in an invitation to Limerick, Ireland, for a guest performance at the Irish World Academy of Music and Dance. His Academy commencement piece, *The Happy Prince* by Oscar Wilde, was performed for the 150th anniversary of the founding of the University of Theatre and Film Arts in Budapest.

Pursuing film scoring, Akos has scored many short films by directors of his generation. These include *Határ* [Border] (Mátyás Szabó, dir.), which received an invitation to the 2017 Karlovy Vary Future Frames Program, and silent film *Szaladják* [Runnovich] (Máté Czakó, dir.), for which he was awarded Best Film Music in the 48-Hour Film Festival. Further, he has collaborated on Television productions for HBO Europe and Discovery Channel.

Akos' work permitted him to represent the Academy abroad on numerous occasions, to include the Aubagne Film Festival (Marseille), the Hungarian Cultural Institute (Brussels) and the Academia di Santa Cecilia

(Rome), among others. He has been among finalists in international film music compositions, and has been twice awarded the Zoltán Kodály Scholarship, the highest ranking, state-funded award for young composers.

Akos made a considerable contribution to *The Cambridge Encyclopedia of Historical Performance in Music*. The editors, Colin Lawson (Royal College of Music, London) and Robin Stowell (Cardiff University), requested he prepare the music examples for publication in the book, which was released October 2018.



Also in 2018, Akos was selected as one of twelve participants—from an international field of over 400—in the “30th Annual ASCAP Film Scoring Workshop,” one of the industry’s most prestigious and acclaimed programs for film composers. Akos’ final assignment for the Workshop, was to rescore a scene from “A Cure for Wellness” (Gore Verbinski, dir.). The scene and its music may be heard [HERE](#).

Apart from composing for concert, theatre and film, he has also participated in the Hungarian National Opera and Franz Liszt Academy of Music projects as orchestrator and score editor. Furthering his involvement in film scoring, Akos has in the past both assisted and studied with a Hungarian-American artist, noted Hollywood film composer Adam Balazs, assisting as a music copyist, orchestrator, conductor, pianist, music editor and music director.

Akos is a resident of London and Budapest, Hungary.
